Association News

The February 14th board meeting marked Joe Chao's last meeting as a board member. Joe has been a

staunch supporter of this community and has a treasure trove of knowledge of previous boards and actions, why things had been done the way they were and the outcomes from those actions.

Joe has always been willing to share his expertise and construction experience to help find solutions to situations that develop. Joe will be missed but I am sure he will continue to provide sage advice and information as needed.

At our last board meeting, a member challenged us to find residents who are experienced in areas where we need support and ask them to volunteer their time. While there are many areas where we could use help, on almost every committee, the specific need that generated the challenge was for people experienced in engineering disciplines who could help identify future needs and requirements regarding infrastructure, to include aging storm drains, roads and waterways. If you have the required knowledge and/or experience and are willing to help, please contact any board member.

Many residents have expressed strong feelings both pro and con about the Access Control Committee's investigation into using remote guarding at the front gate during late night, low access periods. Other gated communities in NE Florida have switched to remote guards and have not found a significant change in safety. The proposal has the potential to save the community \$30k to \$50k per year by eliminating one shift from our current guard contract. Despite what you may have read on social media, no decision has yet been made and a formal proposal has not even been submitted to the board. We have read and logged each response that has been submitted and are taking all the inputs into consideration. We will keep you up to date as we move closer to a decision.

Speaking of social media, the Member's Forum on our web page was intended for residents to ask questions or pass on ideas. Unfortunately, the Forum has been moving toward becoming just another social media site that includes arguments between residents, political comments and misinformation, which upsets many and creates more work for those who try to respond. Some residents have recommended we do away with the Forum, but Jon Bastress and I have agreed to develop a set of guidelines that will return the Forum to its original purpose.

Our Annual Member Meeting is on March 8th at 6:30pm at the Clay County Fairgrounds, 2467 SR 16 W, Green Cove Springs, in the Patron Life Exhibit Hall 2, next to the Cattleman's Arena. If you have not already, please send in or drop off the proxy that was mailed to you.

To run for the Board of Directors, you must be a resident in good standing. Unfortunately, for the second year in a row, there were only two applicants for the two openings on the board. This year, Trevor Rothfels and Neil Kennedy submitted applications. Both gentlemen have current financial agreements with MPCA and some members have expressed concern whether it is appropriate for them to serve on the board. After searching Florida statutes and conversing with our lawyer, we have found that their service is legal and ethical if they do not participate in any discussion or vote for something that would financially affect them. Both men are intelligent and hard working with strong ties to the community and we applaud their willingness to volunteer for extra responsibilities.

Your board has evolved and progressed since taking over from developer control three years ago. We continue to look for more efficient ways to meet the community's obligations while also trying to reduce costs and save money for each of us. If you have ideas that could help achieve that goal, we will happily examine them and see if we can implement them within our rules and Florida laws.





Irrigation Rules During Daylight Saving Time

Daylight saving time begins at 2am on Sunday, March 13. With the change in clocks comes new irrigation rules that are set by the St. Johns Water Management District. Here are the restrictions for watering your lawn and garden during this time:

Landscape irrigation is limited to the following days:

- Wednesday and Saturday for residential landscape irrigation at addresses that end in odd numbers or have no address.
- Thursday and Sunday for residential landscape irrigation at addresses that end in even numbers.
- Tuesday and Friday for nonresidential landscape irrigation.

The restrictions apply to water withdrawn from ground or surface water, from a private well or pump, or from a public or private water utility. If you have any questions, visit the website of the St. Johns Water Management District.

This past month we painted a house here in Magnolia Point, our first since arriving here back in 2020. The home, located at 1830 Colonial Drive, used to be an orange type of color, now it's a bluish gray, called Intercoastal Gray with Linen White Trim. It's fresh and we did it the old fashioned way, 2 coats on every surface with a brush and roller. You don't get that with contractors who spray your house and call it 2 coats. It's pure deception, and most do not back-roll it as is required with spraying.

This job took us just over 2 weeks, not 2 days.....by rolling, the paint is applied thicker and it is more consistent over time. You may notice some fading areas on your home's exterior paint, that's because it was sprayed and applied too thin.

The Moxie Girls have 273 points and the Pretty in Pink team have 267.




