
Breakfast with Santa:



Association News

Your Board of Directors has agreed to use this column to communicate matters of interest to members of the association monthly. Authorship is rotated among board members.

At the November meeting, the Board unanimously approved the Operating and the Reserve Fund budgets for 2022, including transferring \$325,000 from the Operating Fund

to the Reserve Fund. This means the 2022 regular assessment will remain the same. Barring any emergencies, the Reserve Fund should be adequately funded for the year. The budgets are posted on the HOA website, www.magpt.com, in the Finance Reports section.

If you have not given our association your current email address and permission to communicate with you electronically, contact our Community Association Manager (CAM) Mary Marchiano at 904-940-1002, ext. 323 or email *cam@magpt.com*. Emails will keep you better informed and lower our postage costs.

For the first time, the Budget Assumptions by account number have been posted to give everyone clarity regarding our income and expenditures, thus providing greater transparency. We will continue to provide the monthly and year-to-date financial statements with actual amounts compared to budget. The financial report will explain any significant differences between budgeted and actual amounts. You are always welcome to email me or call me regarding any financial questions. I will do my best to respond to you, or if I do not know, I will seek answers for you. All Directors' phone numbers and email addresses are on our website under the Board of Directors section.

Most expenditure line items have increased in 2022 and I would like to give you an explanation of the major line items and explain the increases. Our largest expenditure is the Club Use Fees, budgeted at about \$450,000, which are presented in account 5190 and 5191, and account for 40% of our budget. This amounts to about \$39 per home per month or \$466 per year. This fee provides all owners and their resident children to use the swimming pool, tennis courts, pickle ball courts, playground, Pub, and restaurant under The Club Use Agreement. Most major homeowner associations have a cost for all amenities, and usually own at least a swimming pool. In our neighborhood, these amenities are privately owned by the Magnolia Point Golf and County Club. The golf course is also private, and not part of the Use Agreement.

Here, I should explain that account 5191 Red Nine – Contracted Maintenance is part of the private golf course. The golf course used to be three 9-hole golf courses, but a number of years ago the Red Nine was taken out of play. The Club Agreement requires those nine holes be maintained with a modest appearance, not to be playable, and they are posted as "No Trespassing." Under the Agreement, the association (HOA) withholds the cost of the Red Nine mowing from the Club and contracts separately for its maintenance. The Directors are of the opinion that our homeowners are in support of the Club and continue to believe that financially supporting it is appropriate. Accordingly, the Club has been given a 5% fee increase in 2022. This is the first increase since the inception of the agreement in 2011. The Strategic Planning Committee, chaired by Mitch Timberlake is undertaking a study to determine homeowner sentiment regarding the Use Agreement. So, please make every effort to complete said survey.

The second largest expenditure is Access Control, budgeted at about \$240,000, and accounting for about 21% of our spending. This expense is for an outsourced guard service under a Security Agreement. The budgeted cost increase is 3% due primarily to increased wages.


The third largest expenditure is management company fees for May Management. Under contract, the Management Company, primarily using our Community Association Manager, Mary Marciano and her assistant Sherry Turner are our primary contacts for our overall management. This management includes contracts, accounting, communication, legal, and dealing with most any day-to-day issues and problems. This cost is approximately \$130,000 or 11% of our budget, The Management Company Agreement fee increased about 2.5% for 2022.

The last direct expenditure that I would like to mention is under our common Landscape Area Contract for \$79,000, which is for maintenance of the common areas. This includes about \$21,000 to maintain the "Tower Park" area on US 17 that we own. The same company, under separate contract, mows the Red 9 grass. That contractor gets about 9% of our spending, and its fees are increased annually under a CPI agreement which gave them about 3% increase for 2022.

The last major use of funds is the movement of money in account 8100, to transfer 22% of our revenues to the Reserve Fund. These funds are budgeted and expended on long term projects to maintain and replace our community infrastructure such as roads, drainage, and lighting.

Please note that since the resident-controlled Board have taken over our association's revenues and expenses, spending has been reduced in many areas such as accounting, management fees, common area maintenance costs, and gate security costs. For this reason, we have not had any annual assessment increases since 2018. Now, the opportunities to reduce spending are very limited.

All residents are encouraged to attend monthly board meetings in the clubhouse dining room. We thank our resident Club owners, the Rothfels, who graciously provide the room free of charge.

I can't always remember every detail, but the impression of holidays and family Christmas traditions fill my memories, all accompanied by twinkling lights, the smell of evergreen trees, and the aromatic scent of cinnamon in the kitchen.

Baking cookies for Santa on Christmas Eve is a tradition many families hold dear, but cookies are perfect anytime during the holidays. Bake cookies for friends and family and store them in decorative tins—they are tasty gifts to send home with guests and holiday visitors. Make it a family tradition!

From my family to yours, I hope you have a blessed holiday season!

RECIPE

Soft & Chewy Gingerbread Cookies

- 3 ¼ Cups all-purpose flour
- 1 1/2 tsp ground ginger
- 1 1/12 tsp cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp ground cloves
- 1 tsp baking soda
- ½ tsp salt
- 34 C unsalted butter (softened 1 ½ sticks0

34 C packed light brown sugar 2/3 C molasses

1 large egg (room temperature)

Royal Icing

- 2 1/2 C powdered sugar
- 4 tbsp warm water
- 2 tbsp meringue powder
- ½ tsp cream of tartar

In a medium bowl, whisk together flour, spices, baking soda, and salt until well combined. Set aside.

In a large bowl, beat butter, brown sugar, and molasses with an electric mixer until fluffy, about 2 minutes. Add egg and beat until combined. With the mixer on low, gradually add dry ingredients to wet ingredients until dough comes together. D not over mix! Divide dough in half. Wrap in plastic wrap and chill in refrigerator until

Preheat oven to 350*F. Take dough out of the fridge and let rest about 10 minutes. Roll each half in between two pieces of parchment paper until 14" thick. Remove top sheets from both. Cut gingerbread men with a 3-inch wide cutter. Remove excess dough, then transfer parchment paper with cut dough to sheet pan (do not lift dough off of



parchment paper as it will lose its shape).

Bake cookies for 9-10 minutes. Let cool on baking sheets for 5 minutes before transferring to wire cooling rack. Repeat with remaining dough. Decorate with royal icing, sprinkles, and other decorations as desired!

Royal Icing

Combine all royal icing ingredients. Beat at low speed until moistened. Beat at medium speed 1-3 minutes or until slightly thickened and glossy. Keep covered until ready to use.

Kathie Cardon has been a fixture of the Magnolia Point Women's Club since its inception. She was one of the five founding members who formed the women's club in 2001.



The problems that arose that next spring were detrimental, to say the least. We had less than 40% coverage on any one green. So, now we overseed the greens yearly.

Also, overseeding protects the Bermuda during the winter months so that we can have a smooth transition in the spring. I'm grateful to my maintenance crew for all they do year-round.
